Academic

4-H Teen Conference: June 24-27 (Gr 9-12)

4 days of activities and workshops for teens from throughout the State.

Barry Conservation 4-H Camps: June 24-Aug 8 (Ages 8-17) Held in the White Mountains for kids who love the outdoors and enjoy hands-on learning.

Hospitality Management Summer Program: July 15-21 (Gr 12)

An introduction to the hospitality industry through presentations, hands-on experience, guest speakers, computer simulations and on-site visits.

Upward Bound: June 17-July 27 (Gr 9-12)

A 6-week program that gives students the skills to succeed in HS & College. Free to eligible students.

Writers Academy: June 25-29, July 9-13 & 16-20 (Gr 5-12)

Young writers exchange literacy experiences, meet local authors, work in small groups, and learn what it means to be a writer.

The Arts

Art Camps: July 23-27, July 30-Aug 3 (Gr 2-12)

The UNH Museum of Art offers half-day camps in subjects such as: drawing, painting, photography, ceramics, and more.

Theatre & Dance STARS: July 9-13, 16-27 (Gr 1-12)

Drama, musical theatre, aerial arts, dance, and advanced theatre academy that include a final production.

SYMS (Summer Youth Music School): July 15-20 (Gr 6- 8), 21-29 (Gr 9-12)

Students concentrate on an instrument or voice along with electives to broaden their experience with an outstanding professional staff.

STEM

(Science, Technology, Engineering, Math)

EPIC – Elementary Program Introducing Computing: June 25-29, July 2-6 (Gr 4-7)

Exposes students to computational thinking by working logically and solving problems creatively. Students program robots to tackle mini real-world challenges.

UNH IOL (Interoperability Lab) Summer Internship: July 9-Aug 3 (Gr 12)

The UNH IOL hosts ambitious high school seniors for a paid internship. Interns gain valuable experience working with global networking companies through hands-on, problem-solving work and site visits.

KEEPERS: July 9-13, 16-20 & 23-27 (Gr 2-5)

(Kids Eager for Engineering Program with Elementary Research-based Science): a hands-on camp that introduces the engineering fields. Students develop inquiry and design skills as they explore real science concepts.

Marine Environmental Science: July 2-16, 16-30 & Aug 13-20 (Gr 10-12)

At Shoals Marine Lab on Appledore Island. Students learn through lab exercises, field work, explorations, and excursions to neighboring islands. Can earn college credit.

Plant Camp! July 9-13 (Gr 3-6)

Students explore plants, their use and their role in our world by learning a plant based skill in the garden, greenhouse or lab.





STEM

Project SMART: July 1-27 (Gr 11&12)

A summer institute using research and projects in one of three study areas: bio- and nanotechnology, space science, or environmental science. Students can earn college credits.

Tech Camps: July 9-13, 16-20 & 23-27 (Gr 6-12)

Tech Camps increase STEM literacy through student engagement in interactive, hands-on, problem solving activities designed to immerse them in the worlds of STEM.
