1. Please answer **four (4) of the eight** questions listed. Choose from fiction questions if your book is fiction and non-fiction questions if your book is a biography or about a real person and tells about real events/non-fiction.
2. Make a poster that shows what we can learn from the main character of the book you chose about being virtuous... (how they teach about faith, hope, love, courage, justice, forgiveness, service, etc.). You can show your character demonstrating a virtue in a scene from the book or make a composite of scenes. Please make your poster illustrations colorful and any writing bold and easy to read.
(Many books highlight several virtues so feel free to point out others you see in your poster!)

NEXT: Choose four of the eight questions below and answer them in your best cursive handwriting on the lined paper on the reverse of this page. Choose Fiction questions if you read a fiction novel and non-fiction if you read a piece of non-fiction. If you need more space, continue your answers on a piece of lined paper and staple it to this packet. Do not forget your name.

FICTION BOOK questions:

1. How is a character in your book similar to a character in another book, movie, or someone you know?
2. What does this book remind you of in your own life?
Which character would you like (or not like) to be your friend? Why?
3. What advice would you give to a particular character? Why?
4. What was one of your favorite lines (or sentences) in what you read? Copy it down and tell why you liked it. It can be more than a sentence, but not too long!
5. If you could change one thing in the book, what would it be? Why would you change it?
6. What surprised you in the book?
7. If you could ask the author about this book, what questions would you ask?
8. Choose 3 new words you learned in this book. What do they mean?

NONFICTION BOOK questions:

1. What do you know now that you didn't know before you read this?
2. What surprised you most about this topic?
What else do you want to know about this topic?
3. Do you think you would read another book by this author? Why or why not?
4. How could you apply what you learned to your own life?
5. If you could change one thing in the book, what would it be? Why would you change it?
6. Why was this topic important to you?
7. Was this information organized in a helpful way? Why or why not? Give examples.
8. Choose 3 new words you learned in this book. What do they mean?
