### **New Hampshire Catholic School Clergy Member of the Year**

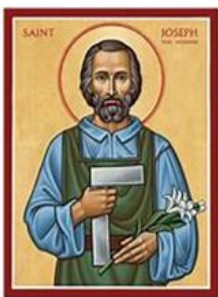
