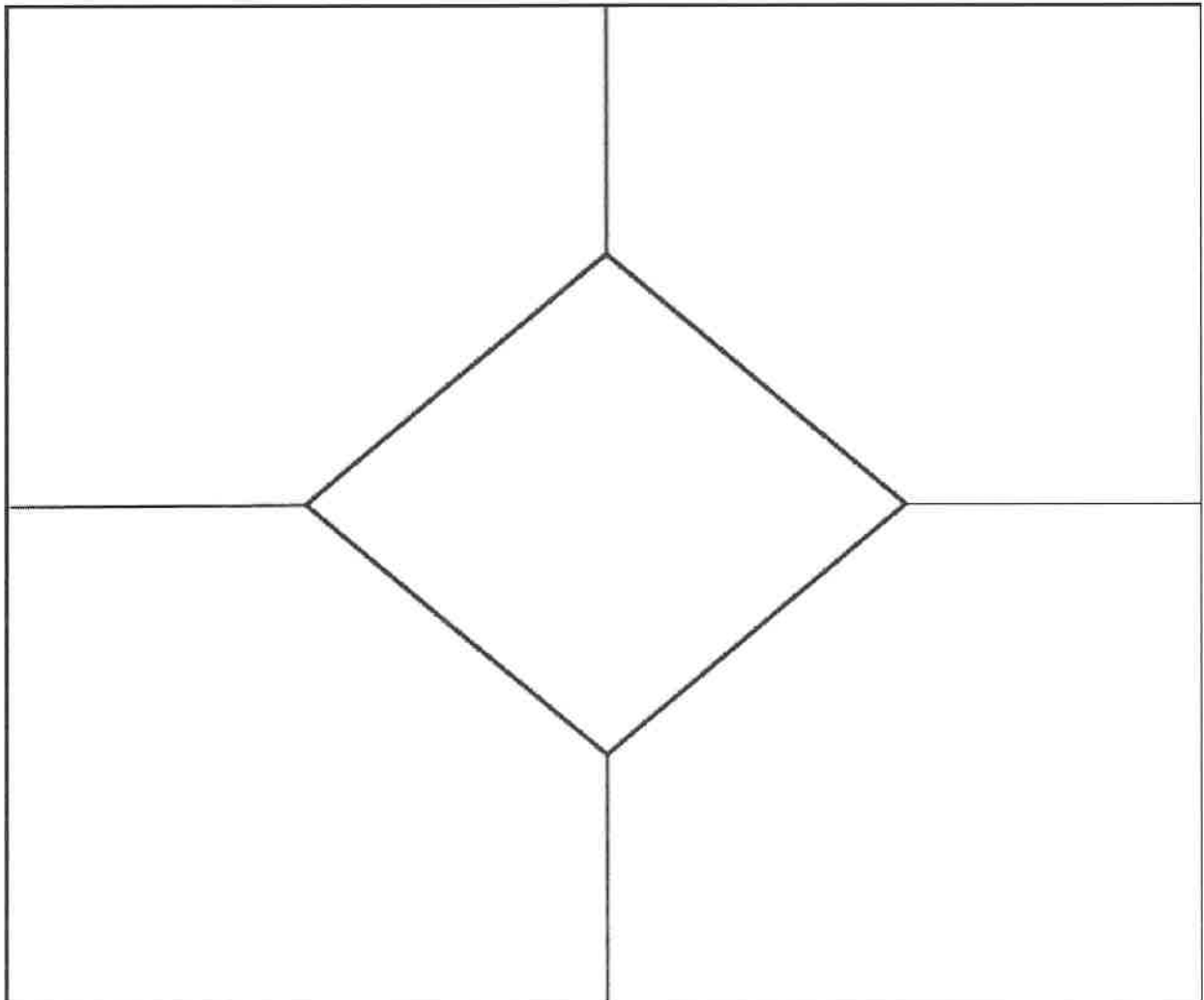

Quilt Square

Read any book of your choice then complete the quilt square following these directions:

1. **In the center**, put the title. **Underline the title**. Write the author's name and your name.
2. In the **top right corner**, draw a picture of the **main character** and **write his or her name**. *Think: what is a main character? How did you know this character (and not any of the other characters) was the main character?*
3. In the **top left corner**, draw a picture of **one** of the **settings** in your book. Draw it as you imagined it while **including at least three details from the book itself**.
4. In the **bottom left corner**, write a **theme or moral** in the book. It should be a **lesson you and/or the character learned that you can apply in your own life** (examples: don't judge someone based on appearances, bad things don't last forever, accept others' differences, the power of friendship/ teamwork, be honest, help those in need, appreciate what you have while you have it, love what makes you unique, it's okay to ask for help, with great power comes great responsibility). **Describe the theme in the part of the quilt in one sentence.**
5. In the **bottom right corner**, draw your **favorite scene** from the book and a **one sentence caption explaining what is happening**. *Think: why was this your favorite part? How was it important to the story?*
